Results Reporting:

Applicable Clinical Trials (ACTs)* and NIH funded trials are required to register on ClinicalTrials.gov within 21 days of enrollment of the first subject.

i.e., date of when the 1st participant signs a study consent form.

An active study record should be updated <u>at least every 12 months</u>, or within 30 calendar days of a change to protocol information, including recruitment status or primary completion date.

Even if nothing has changed in the study, the record requires yearly review and approval.

Study results of ACT studies (42 CRF 11) and/or NIH-supported clinical trials are required to be reported <u>no later than one</u> <u>year after the primary completion date</u>.

The date on which the last participant in a clinical study was examined or received an intervention to collect final data for the primary outcome measure. Whether the clinical study ended according to the protocol or was terminated does not affect this date.
